Aligning School Communities Around

WHY WE PLAY

n an effort to align school communities around the purpose of education-based athletic and activity programs, the League's Board of Directors requires local school boards to complete a brief training on WHY WE PLAY-Defining the Purpose of Education-Based Athletic and Activity Programs for the 2019-2020 school year. The training must be completed before approving the Minnesota State High School League's Membership Resolution. The intent of this requirement is to assist schools and their communities in aligning around a shared common language, where every stakeholder clearly understands the purpose of sports in the school community.

Wemust provides tudents with growth that will sustain them beyond physical skill development and the ability to play and win a game. For this to happen, we must align school communities around a deeper purpose.

The purpose of education-based programs is the human growth and development of students and connecting them to caring adults in their learning community. Fewer than 3% of the students who participate in high school athletics will play at the collegiate level and less than 1% will go on to play professionally. This means 97% of the students involved in high school sports will have a terminal experience—they will never again participate in sports at the same organized level in their lifetime. So what are we really giving students if we are only concerned with winning? We must provide students with growth that will sustain them beyond physical skill development and the ability to play and win a game. For this to happen, we must align school communities around a deeper purpose.

We value sports because we believe the students who are involved acquire something meaningful through their participation. Sports provide countless teachable moments where core ethical values such as empathy, honesty, fairness, responsibility, and respect for self and others can be developed. With this said, one of the great myths in our culture is that participation alone builds and develops this character, as if doing a handstand, running a race, hitting a curve ball, or simply suiting up are sufficient to strengthen a young person's moral fiber. Unless a coach teaches and models character and encourages its development in studentathletes, it is more likely organized sports will spoil play and undermine the development of the very character and virtue it claims to build. The potential for the growth and development of character in students only exists if the adults who are in charge of and oversee these experiences are aware of and intentional about this significant role.

Coaches clearly play a significant role in the experience that students have. However, training coaches alone is not enough. Without support of the school community, the current win-at-all-costs sports culture will continue to make winning the only value that comes from participation.

This training, that centers on a shared common language, and supporting the intentional leadership of the Athletic Administrator, will provide an effective response to the demands and pressures of the current win-at-all-cost sports culture.

In an effort to support school leaders around the purpose of education-based programs, the Minnesota School Boards Association (MSBA) has endorsed the WHY WE PLAY initiative that clearly defines the purpose of sports in an educational setting. The initiative will provide school boards with the same shared common language that is being delivered to athletic administrators, coaches, parents, officials, and students around the value of these programs.

By providing MN school boards with this brief but dynamic video training we will align school communities across MN around a shared purpose. We will also provide support so coaches can function from an education-based mindset instead of a win-at-all-cost mindset. This initiative will ultimately provide students with a richer experience; one that fosters learning, growth, fun, and a connection to caring adults in the school community.

Superintendent Report for School Board

- In considering the ESSER III budget we are making three items a top priority:
 *Academic recovery This will allocate dollars for Monday School for the high school,
 before and after school programing and various types of summer school including field
 trips. The summer programs will also include food and transportation as we provided
 this summer.
 - *Social and emotional and mental health for students We will budget for adding an additional part time mental health support for the elementary and seek out ways to support the mental health of high school students through continued work with School Linked Mental Health and opportunities to work through PACT for Families.
 *Furnishings to allow students to physically distance We found last year during our COVID social distancing that students and teachers actually enjoyed using picnic tables to eat, teach and learn outside. We will purchase tables (hopefully with some shading device) so more classrooms can learn outside. Additionally, we will allocate some funds to help make our play areas for students safer in terms of being able to spread out into different areas with tables and benches. These can also become learning areas for classrooms.

We have already committed to using some of these funds for class size reduction for 21/22 at West grades two and three and at East grade 1. We will seek additional staff for reading and math support for the elementary schools, provide devices for paraprofessionals and supplies to support and enhance science instruction in the elementary.

- The state legislature you all know settled and the highlights are positive for funding education, positive for not adding additional unfunded mandates yet providing for guidance in simple policy language to guide us in our work. I will review some features at the meeting on Monday night.
- 3. COVID lingers as an ongoing discussion point among all of us administrators. I am currently working on language from MDE, MDH, CDC and local public health on what I believe will be "strong recommendations" for us in coming back to school. It sounds like the CDC may have language by next week. I do know that the fear across the country is the Delta Variant. In MACCRAY about 50% of staff is vaccinated for COVID leaving 50% possibly susceptible to this variant. RIGHT NOW I DO NOT HAVE ANY INFORMATION ON WHAT DIRECTIVES WILL BE FROM ANY OF THE ENTITIES LISTED ABOVE. We will work to keep students and staff safe in the most expedient and safest way possible as we move forward ALL IN at MACCRAY.

- 4. Teacher Staffing is ongoing. Judd and Mitch are working tirelessly to have teachers in all classrooms across the district by August 1. This is time consuming work and is taken very seriously and done with specifically detailed reference checks, interview questions and follow through mentoring and support if hired.
- 5. Back to School Information should be arriving in homes electronically and in paper format very soon. We are taking extra caution to try to ensure we have covered all aspects of return to school since we haven't had a "normal" return to school for over a year. The theme for the year will be "Connections". As such we will be working to bring staff and students together throughout the school year as everyone returns to school.
- 6. Scott R. will report on negotiations at the meeting. But for now please know we have met with all non certified staff and have our second meeting planned with teachers for July 14 at 1 pm.

I've said it many times but will say it again. People often ask what we do at school during the summer. What you have just read about is only part of what all is going on during the summer. And, I have not even addressed construction here because Dan will be giving a detailed report during the meeting and tour on Monday.
